The Euro-Mediterranean region boasts a rich and diverse heritage, shaped by centuries of cultural exchange and interaction. A melting pot of different languages, traditions and customs, the region shares a heritage and a deep sense of identity and belonging. Today, this cultural legacy continues to inspire and inform our shared values and aspirations, reminding us of the importance of building bridges and fostering understanding between different cultures and communities.

In that spirit, the 43 Member States of the Union for the Mediterranean launched the "Mediterranean Capitals of Culture & Dialogue" (MCCD) initiative during their **7th Regional Forum** in November 2022.

Based on the call of Ministers of Culture of the Euro-Mediterranean region on 17 June 2022 in Naples, as well as the recommendation of more than 200 young representatives from civil society of over 20 countries at the Forum des Mondes Méditerranéens on 7 February 2022 in Marseille, this initiative was shaped to further promote the diversity and shared identity of the Euro-Mediterranean region and contribute to a better mutual understanding of its peoples.

The initiative core objectives

The cultural programmes of the selected capitals will include a great variety of activities that count with the participation of different civil society actors: from art exhibitions, music, film, fashion, food festivals and concerts, to sports events, workshops and roundtables, all citizens are encouraged to take part in the initiative.

EURO-MEDITERRANEAN

Encouraging intercultural dialogue and greater mutual understanding across the **Euro-Mediterranean region:** the initiative will aim to combine local objectives and realities with solid regional visions.

TERRITORIAL COOPERATION

Promoting innovative partnerships at the local level to enhance regional integration: collaboration will be open to all eligible cities, irrespective of previous cooperation and territorial collocation, to promote fruitful interactions of territories with limited integration.

BOTTOM-UP APPROACH

Strengthening the role of civil society, and particularly young people, in shaping Euro-Mediterranean cooperation: every step of the initiative is designed and implemented in close cooperation with networks of youth and civil society actors.







Who can apply?

- Cities (represented by their public local or regional authority), regardless of their size.
- Located in a country of the Union for the Mediterranean, regardless of whether the city is on the coast or inland.
- Never designated Mediterranean Capital of Culture & Dialogue before.


